Tar Heel Shared Reader Content Activity Module: Shared Reading Text Selection 2

Big Idea:

Students need access to texts that are interesting, and age- and ability-respectful.

Guiding Statement:

1. I choose texts that are the right length to hold my students' attention.

Directions: Read through the following statements and think about and discuss why the length of the book is important to consider when choosing books for beginning readers.

- 1. Students need to be able to follow along with the text to figure out there's one written word for every spoken word.
- 2. Students can learn to anticipate what is being read.
- 3. Students need the opportunity to have as many page-by-page interactions as possible.
- 4. Students can learn to pay attention to the increasingly longer text as they learn that reading is interesting.

Discussion:

Shared reading is one part of a comprehensive literacy program. Students who will benefit from shorter texts are still:

- learning why we read
- building background knowledge
- learning how print works
- learning about the alphabet and phonological awareness
- developing a desire to read

Keep the experience short so that students don't think of it as "work" but rather as something to look forward to and enjoy.
